What's it worth ?

The Welsh Baccalaureate is worth 120 points for university and is an A at A level.



Who accepts it ?

The qualification is accepted by all leading universities including Oxford and Cambridge and works very well as the third A level required for most University Courses. It is very good for employers as it proves that an employee has developed the skills required to work with others and can make decisions.

What does the course cover ?

The Course covers a variety of topics including key skills which are highly beneficial to all careers. The course is also designed to develop the student as a well rounded employee who is able to work with others.
